Welcome to Year 9

This letter aims to provide you with an overview of year 9 in order for you to have an understanding of the curriculum, pastoral work and key dates for the year. You will be provided with further details of any specific events nearer to the time.

Pastoral overview

This year there will be an emphasis on GCSE preparation, organisation and independence for all students. We will be running a variety of active tutoring sessions for students to engage with and will be encouraging organisation and independence around school to prepare them for the world of employment.

We are also focusing on students' attitude to learning (ATL) in lessons. We have five descriptors which students are working towards; these are 'willing to learn, reflective, determined, resilient and self-motivated'. Students can demonstrate outstanding attitudes in class by being focused, paying attention at all times, producing high quality written work, setting themselves goals to achieve, not giving up and reflecting upon their work and actions in the classroom. As a year group, our focus this term is to demonstrate more reflective and resilient behaviours.

In addition to this, we are also focusing on employability skills. Students are learning to demonstrate key skills that will enable them to be successful in the workplace after full time education. We will be asking students to provide examples inside and out of school when they have shown self-motivation, aspiration, accountability and entrepreneurial traits.

Curriculum

Year 9 sees our pupils begin their GCSE curriculum journey by learning new knowledge and skills for each of their core and options subjects. Given this new level of academic challenge, students need to understand the increased importance of having an excellent attitude to learning in all lessons and completing all set homework. It is essential that all pupils use their knowledge organisers in study sessions to become better at factual recall, while continuing to enjoy the varied enrichment curriculum that we offer. Please refer to the attached year overview for a more detailed summary of the Year 9 curriculum. There are also knowledge organisers and further details available on the website (click the study support link on our website homepage).

In year 9, students are invited to take part in an enrichment pathway that will develop a suite of employability skills and/or provide them with a qualification. Some pathways consist of a different topic each term (e.g life skills: First Aid, Basic Food Hygiene and Hospitality) and some take a whole year (Duke of Edinburgh).

With respect to the GCSE timetable, year 9 pupils are placed in sets for English, maths and science and are taught in largely mixed ability classes for all other subjects. All pupils are challenged and supported in equal measure so that they maximise their potential by the end of key stage 4. We decide which set a pupil is placed in by using their formal assessment data as well as knowledge of their classwork. We regularly review the settings and make decisions to move pupils when necessary.
