What to include on storyboard

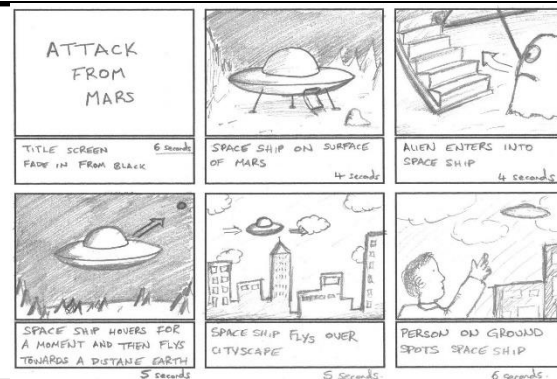
- –Number of scenes
- –Camera Shots
- –Camera Movement
- –Timings
- –Lighting
- –Sounds (dialogue, effects)
- –Locations
- –Camera Type

How to get the marks

Timings, camera shots, camera angles, camera movements, lighting, timings, sounds, sound effects, locations,
